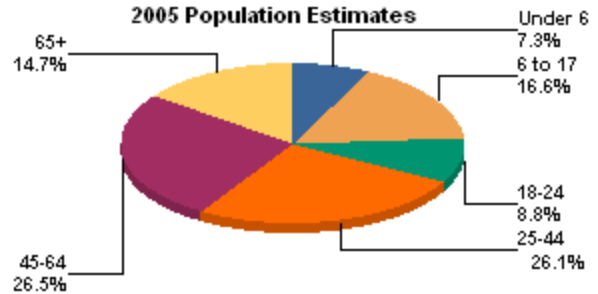

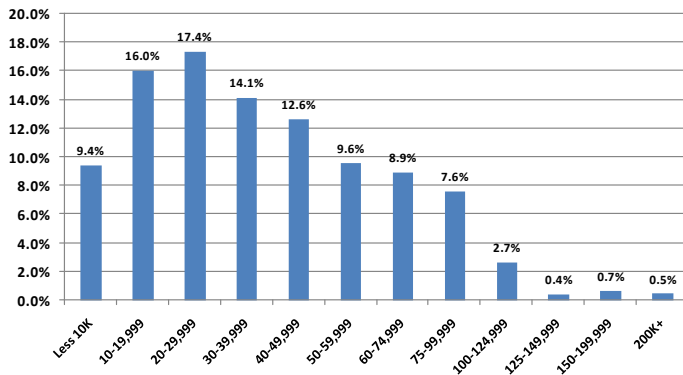

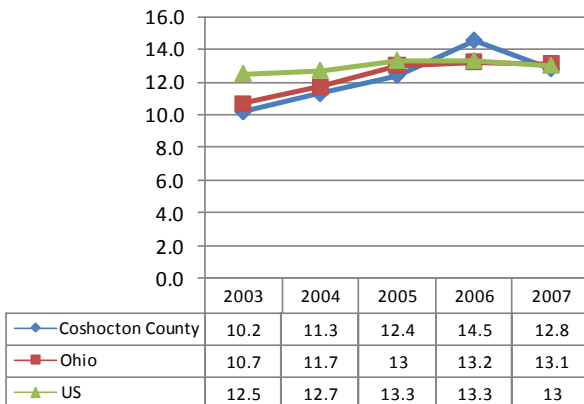

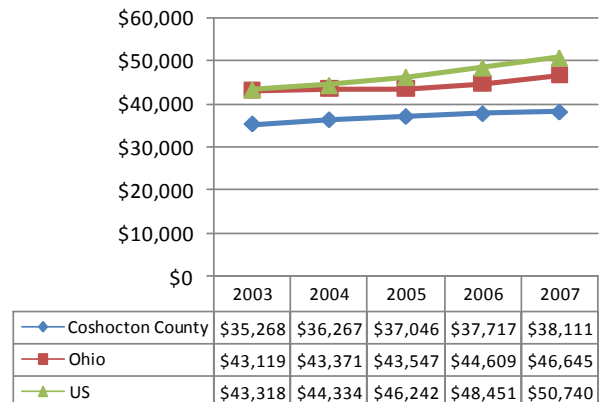
Percent of Population by Household Income ³

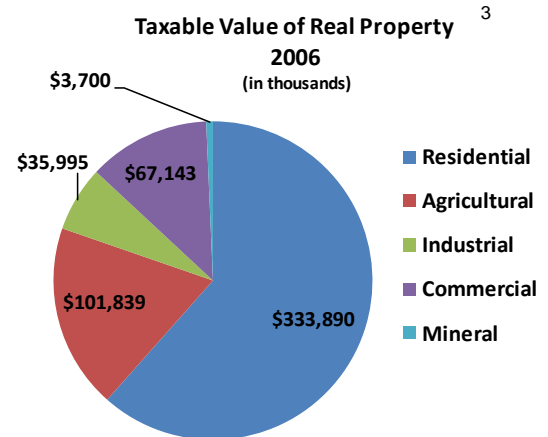

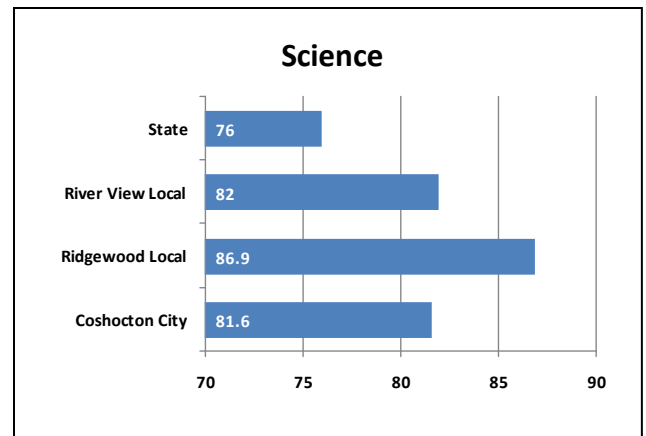
